### **CAT'S EYE EDITORIAL INC. NOMINATED FOR EMMY**

ATLANTA, GA – May 20, 2002 — Atlanta-based post-production company Cat's Eye Editorial Inc., lead by Top Cat, Kitty Ray Swain, has been nominated for a Southern Regional Emmy award for Outstanding Achievement: Television Programming Excellence/Youth Program for "The Journey of Sir Douglas Fir: A Reader's Musical," along with Producer/Writer Ric Reitz and Producer Jim Sedlak.

Cat's Eye Editorial Inc. also won a bronze Telly award in the Children's Programming category for *The Journey of Sir Douglas Fir*. The Telly Awards are a nationwide competition open to video producers on categories ranging from internal and external communications to broadcast commercials and promotions.

The Emmy awards will be announced Saturday, June 8, 2002 in Atlanta, Georgia.
